



Prohibition of Slavery or Forced Labour – Resources

Summary

The use of slavery, forced or compulsory labour, or being complicit in any other entity's use of such labour is strictly prohibited and unacceptable under any circumstances. Such cases have to be reported to the competent authority.

The Code

40. Signatory Companies will not use slavery, forced or compulsory labour, or be complicit in any other entity's use of such labour.
